



NOODLEBIB

Noodlebib assists you in creating a perfectly formatted **MLA, APA, or Chicago** style bibliography. Start by clicking on **Electronic Resources** on the MCC Library Homepage. Choose **Noodlebib** from the alphabetical list of databases.

The first time you log in you must **Create a Personal ID**.

You must connect through the Electronic Resources Page to create your ID or go to <http://tinyurl.com/noodlebib> to establish yourself as a Middlesex student. We recommend that you use your MCC A number and password to access this account. Once your ID is established go directly to <http://www.noodletools.com/login.php>. Students who already have accounts may be prompted to add their graduation year and initials if they have not already done so.

Sign into the account you created.

Click on **Create a new List** and choose between **MLA Advanced, APA Advanced** or **Chicago/Turabian Advanced** depending on what your instructor requires.

Enter the topic of your paper in the area **Description**.

Click on **Create List**.

For each entry start at the top by using the drop menu, **Select a Citation Type**.

After making a choice, click on **Create Citation**.

Answer the questions on each succeeding screen and click on **Next** at the bottom of the screen.

If you've used one of the MCC databases

- Publication medium is **Online**
- Articles were originally published in **print form** and it is a **Subscription Database**.
- The name of the DATABASE should be on your printout.

When you come to the form where you enter the specific data you must fill in any fields that have **asterisks (*)**.

When complete, click on **Check for Errors**. This does **NOT** spell check but checks for necessary fields and capitalization.

Click on **Update Citation**.

Then return to the top of the page and begin your second entry.

On the right side of the screen, you can edit or delete any entries or click on **Parentetical Reference** to show you how to do an in-text reference.

You should now have a perfectly formatted and alphabetized WORKS CITED LIST that you can print, save and spell-check (**recommended**). Noodlebib will save this record for one year.
