NOTES:

- A minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA is required for admission to this major
- A maximum of 68 credits will be accepted in transfer
- A minimum grade of "C-" is required for a course to transfer to Framingham
- Students completing this sequence of Middlesex courses must select courses that meet the requirements of the Commonwealth Transfer Compact (CTC). As a result, students completing this Associate Degree program will be guaranteed a minimum of 60 credits of transfer credit, to be applied to the Framingham Liberal Studies Bachelor of Arts degree as general education courses, courses in the major or free electives. The requirements of the CTC are as follows:
 - 6 credits Composition/Writing, i.e., ENG101 and ENG102
 - 3 credits college-level Math (note: must be above MAT100)
 - 8 credits Science
 - 9 credits Social/Behavioral Science
- Students must complete a minimum of 2-3 concentrations at Framingham to receive a Liberal Studies baccalaureate degree
