The Global Studies Associate in Arts, Liberal Arts and Sciences degree program is an interdisciplinary program of study that examines social, cultural, environmental and political issues within a world historical context. The program challenges students to critically evaluate the commonalities and differences within various cultural and social frameworks, and looks at relationships between international and national systems that influence the world community.

Career and Transfer Outlook:

Most students in Global Studies continue their studies toward a bachelor's degree. Students may pursue various careers in teaching, government, business or law.
