A Tip Sheet on

How to Study for Your Math Final Exam

1. **Start TODAY!** You will do much better on your final if you spend 20 minutes each day studying than if you try to study an entire semester's worth of math the night before the exam.
2. **Sit down in a quiet place and do the final exam review sheet as if you were taking the actual final exam. Time yourself. You should be able to do it within a two hour time span. After you are finished use the answer key and correct it. If you can't find your mistakes, ask for help.**
3. **Form a study group with a student or two from class. Do your review together. Make up exam questions for each other. Compare your lists of important facts to remember.**
4. **Go over all of your exams. Do the problems that you got wrong on the test first. Those are the ones you need to work on the most.**
5. **Go back through your text book and do the first, middle and last problems from each section that you covered in class. If you can't do all three, you need to study that section.**
6. **Do the chapter reviews and cumulative chapter reviews. This is an excellent way to get ready for your final.**
7. **Make a list of the topics you are having difficulty with, or the math problems you can't do. Bring it to the Math Lab to go over with a tutor.**
8. **Be good to yourself. Get plenty of rest. Take a break - take a walk.**
