

What are Transition Words?

Transition words and sentences develop a relationship between ideas, connecting topics and helping the thoughts flow smoothly.

They make the reader feel that the concepts are not isolated but tied together. Transition words make reference both to the idea that precedes and the idea that follows.

The following transition words are categorized for specific needs and places in essays.

It is important to show relationships between ideas within a paragraph, and also to connect the topics as the reader progresses from paragraph to paragraph.
