Middlesex Community College Course Placement Requirements

Students admitted to Middlesex Community College (MCC) degree and certificate programs are required to demonstrate their academic skill level in mathematics, reading and writing before registering for classes. If you have graduated from high school within the last three years and can provide a transcript documenting an overall GPA of 2.7 or higher, you will be placed directly into college level coursework.

For information on how SAT scores can be considered for placement go to MCC Admissions at <https://www.middlesex.mass.edu/admissions/default.aspx>.

If you are transferring credits in English or math from another college or have taken the MCC placement test at an earlier date, you may qualify for an exemption from all or part of the test.

All other students are required to take the placement test. Massachusetts public colleges, including Middlesex, use the College Board Accuplacer Course Placement testing instrument. Your placement test results should accurately reflect your current academic skills. We strongly encourage you to prepare for your placement test. Arrive for your appointment with a picture ID and be ready to do your best work.
