General Advising Notes

- Preparation for College Math will not satisfy the college level math elective unless Modules 1-12 have been completed.
- Students should begin their Middlesex experience by taking the foundation-level courses (English and mathematics) prior to, or along with, their electives. Writing and mathematics are fundamental to every subsequent course that students experience in the Liberal Studies program.
- It is recommended that students sample courses from a variety of discipline areas each semester, rather than focusing on the areas they are most interested in at the beginning of their studies and leaving the courses they find less interesting until the end of their program coursework.
- Humanities Electives are courses with the following prefixes: ART, COM, DAN, ENG, ETH, HUM, LAN, MUS, PHL, REL, THE.
- Science Electives are courses with the following prefixes: BIO, CHE, ENV, PHY, SCI.
- Behavioral and Social Sciences Electives are courses with the following prefixes: ANT, ECO, GOV, HST, LGL, PSY, and SOC.
