Career & Transfer Outlook

This certificate program prepares students for entry-level careers related to children and families in a growing field. Massachusetts has seen approximately a two percent increase from 2015-2017 for the need for Behavioral Health services and the Massachusetts Children's Behavioral Health Advisory Council continues to advocate for increased education, services, and the collaboration between the types of services available. Graduates are competitive candidates for immediate employment in agencies providing CBH services. Since coursework completed as part of the CBH certificate fulfills many of the course requirements in the Human Services degrees at MCC, qualifying students can also apply credits from their CBH certificate toward their Associate's Degree and can do so in a full- or part-time basis.

Helpful Hints

Students who currently hold a Human Services degree (or are currently working to obtain their Human Services degree) are encouraged to apply earned credits toward the certificate. Education majors and Criminal Justice majors are also encouraged to pursue a CBH certificate.

Note: In order for a student to be eligible to participate in an academic, community or clinical program that involves potential unsupervised contact with children, the disabled, the elderly, or other vulnerable populations, the student may be required to undergo a Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) check and/or a Sex Offender Registry Information (SORI) check. This process can take up to several weeks to complete.
