**Helpful Hints**

- ENG 101 and PSY 122 are prerequisites for most EDU courses.
- EDU 101 and EDU 153 are prerequisites for the program capstone, EDU 251. EDU 251 should be taken in students' last semester before graduating. Students must be in good academic standing and obtain permission from the Department before registering.
- The following courses may be taken as EDU electives: EDU 100; EDU 102; EDU 103; EDU 110; EDU 150; EDU 154 or EDU 252.
- In order for a student to be eligible to participate in an academic, community or clinical program that involves potential unsupervised contact with children, the disabled, the elderly, or other vulnerable populations, the student may be required to undergo a Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) check and/or a Sex Offender Registry Information (SORI).

**Career and Transfer Outlook**

This program is best suited for individuals who are interested in pursuing a career in Pre-K through Second Grade education. Graduates meet the academic requirements for Lead Teacher Certification as currently specified by the Massachusetts Department of Early Education and Care. Many graduates continue their studies toward a bachelor's degree. Students should check the requirements for transfer with their academic advisor.
