Helpful Hints

- Students are encouraged to take Math in their first semester to allow time for completion of the Math sequence.
- Humanities are courses with the following prefixes: ART, COM, DAN, ENG, ETH, HUM, LAN, MUS, PHL, REL, THE.
- IDS 101 is required for this program. All EET students must take IDS 101 within the first 30 credits of the degree. Two additional IDS classes from the following list are required:
 IDS 102 - General Education Seminar: Service Learning
 IDS 103 - General Education Seminar: Leadership
 IDS 104 - General Education Seminar: Research
 IDS 105 - General Education Seminar: Interdisciplinary Weekend
 IDS 106 - General Education Seminar: Career Exploration
 IDS 107 - General Education Seminar: Career Development
 IDS 108 - General Education Seminar: Wellness
 IDS 109 - General Education Seminar: Grappling with Wicked Problems.
- SOC 118 – Multicultural Communications is recommended as General Education elective for Elementary Education students.
- Physical Sciences are science courses with the following prefixes CHE, GEO, PHY.
- Biological Sciences are science courses with a BIO prefix.
- In order for a student to be eligible to participate in an academic, community or clinical program that involves potential unsupervised contact with children, the disabled, the elderly, or other vulnerable populations, the student will be required to undergo a Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) check and/or a Sex Offender Registry Information (SORI) check and/or fingerprint check.
- Students can choose any course as a Free Elective including any EDU course. EDU 101 and EDU 251 are highly recommended.
