General Advising Notes

- Student will need to apply for certification directly through the MA Dept. of EEC.
- ENG 101 eligibility is a prerequisite for EDU 100 and EDU 122 courses.
- In order for a student to be eligible to participate in an academic, community or clinical program that involves potential unsupervised contact with children, the disabled, the elderly, or other vulnerable populations, the student may be required to undergo a Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) check and/or a Sex Offender Registry Information (SORI).

Career and Transfer Outlook

This program is recommended for candidates who are just entering the field of Early Childhood Education or those who do not wish to seek MA EEC Lead Teacher (Level 2) certification or an Associate degree at this time. Candidates will be able to transfer six of the certificate credits toward an Associate degree in Early Childhood Education, and 3 credits and the Practicum hours toward MA EEC Lead Teacher (Level 2) certification.

Certificate Programs

Certificate programs can serve as the basis for further higher education or professional studies. Certificate programs require students to complete specified coursework, mainly related to particular fields of employment.

While many students enroll in a certificate program in preparation for direct entry into employment, they often return to college, part time or full time, and apply the credits previously earned to an associate degree program.
