General Advising Notes

- Students are encouraged to take Math in their first semester to allow time for completion of the Math sequence.
- IDS 101 is required for this program. All Elementary Education students must take IDS 101 within the first 30 credits of the degree. Two additional IDS classes are required in this program.
- SCI 121 is only offered in the fall; SCI 122 is only offered in the spring. These two courses do not need to be taken in sequence.
- Physical Sciences are science courses with the following prefixes CHE, GEO, PHY.
- Biological Sciences are science courses with a BIO prefix.
- SOC 118 Multicultural Communications and PSY 101 – Introduction to Psychology are recommended as the preferred General Education Electives.
- COM 103 Public Speaking and Professional Presentations is recommended as the preferred Humanities Elective.
- Students can choose any course as a Free Elective.
