Helpful Hints

- IDS 101 First Year Experience is required for all students in this program. This one-credit course provides orientation to the college and the student experience.
- THE 118 Modern Drama is only offered in Spring semesters.
- THE 117 History of Theater is only offered in Fall semesters.
- It is strongly recommended that students begin their educational career at Middlesex with foundation-level courses in English and math, along with one or two program requirements.
- Due to the intense nature of theater production. students should plan on at least two semesters at MCC without outside scheduling constraints.

Career and Transfer Outlook

Students interested in transferring to a bachelor's degree program should look at the Fine and Performing Arts Theater Option in Liberal Arts and Sciences.

The Performing Arts Theater Option prepares students for work in the field or transfer to specialized bachelor's degree programs or nonacademic programs. Graduates are also fully prepared to audition or interview in the highly competitive, professional marketplace, as well as in community theater. If transferring, students should check the requirements of the transfer institution and meet with career and academic/transfer counselors at MCC for specific program planning.
