## General Advising Notes

- The Medical Assisting Certificate and Associate Degree program is offered on the Lowell campus during the day, and starts in the Fall semester
- Students must complete the Medical Assisting Certificate program first before admittance into the associate degree program.
- At the completion of the 2nd semester students have completed the requirements for the certificate and are eligible to take the Medical Assisting Certification Exam. Students are also able to apply to complete the associate degree.
- CAP 101 is a prerequisite course to the Medical Assisting Certificate program but will also meet the degree requirements.
- One of the General Electives courses could be substituted with three 1 credit IDS courses.
