

Asian American Population Results SP17, FA17, & SP18







53% of the Asian American population **attended SI sessions** for ENG or ELL at least one time



86% of Asian American students who attended SI successfully completed the course compared to 82% of Asian American students who did not attend SI

2.69

Average GPA in ENG and ELL courses was .97 points higher for SI participants (2.69 compared with 1.71)
