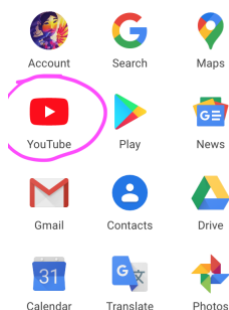


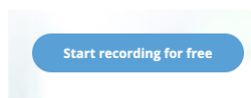
How to create a video on Screencast-o-matic & upload to YouTube to share

1. Anyone with a Gmail account has access to a personal YouTube channel. You can set it up in your Gmail account homepage (where you view your new email):



Heads up: you have to verify your YouTube account to upload videos over 15 minutes. You can do this when you first sign up and create your channel. Here's a [quick guide](#) on how to verify your account after you create your personal YouTube channel.

2. First, to create a free video **under 15 minutes**, go to <https://screencast-o-matic.com/>



3. Select:

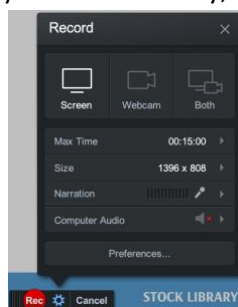
Sign Up, It's Free

4. Then, sign up for an account using an email address: _____

Launch Free Recorder

5. Next:

6. Open Screen recorder, and make your selections: do you want to record your computer screen, your webcam only, or both?



- Now it's time to Record, so use the red REC button to begin. You'll see a helpful 3-2-1 countdown before the recording begins.

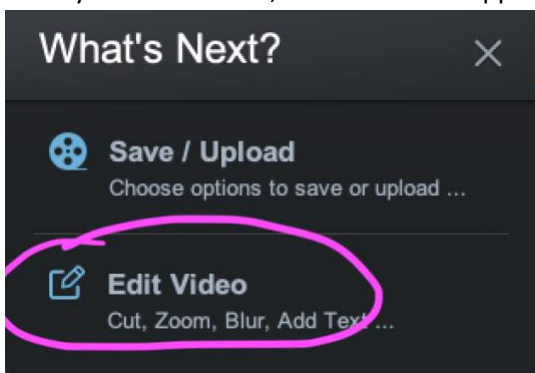


- When you've finished recording, hit the pause button to stop recording, then you see this menu:

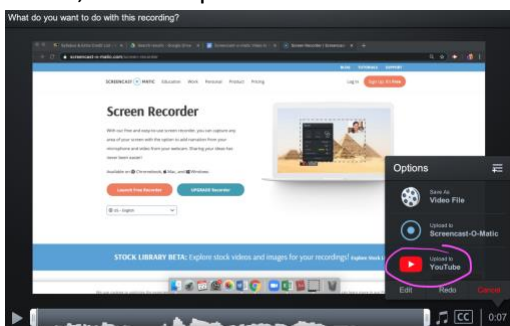


If you like your video click "Done". If you'd like to rerecord it, hit the trash icon to delete the recording and start over.

- Once you click "Done", and new menu appears: select "Edit Video".

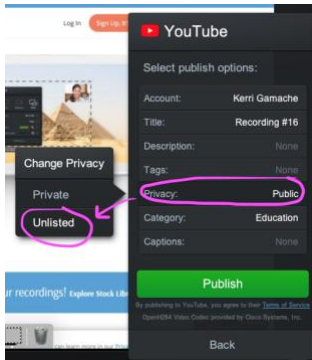


- Then, select "Upload to YouTube":



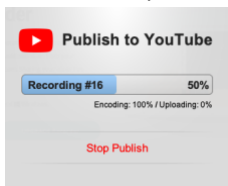
- You're then given publishing options. Most prefer to keep their video "unlisted" or available only to those with a link (so, it's not searchable on Google or YouTube*).

*Note for Faculty: This also means you can't embed it in Blackboard (Bb) as a "Mashup" by searching for it. However, if you download as a video file, you can upload it to Bb that way, but it won't link to a larger view in YouTube. Better yet, you can simply post the link on Bb instead.

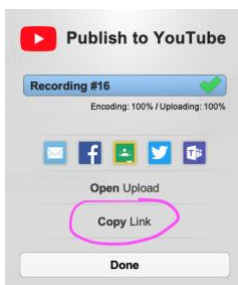


12. Select “Unlisted”.

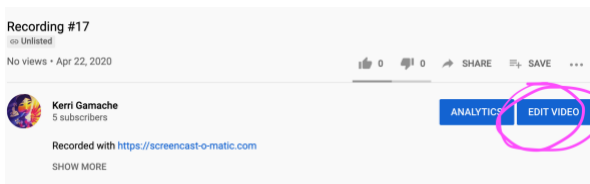
13. Next, it will publish automatically to YouTube. I can rename the file right in YouTube.



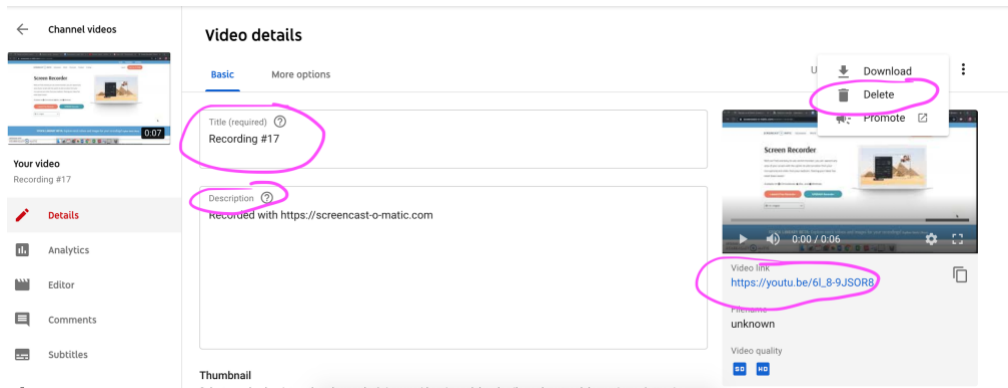
14. Then, I’m given the option to get the shareable link, so I can email it in Bb, or email it to students.



15. If I paste the link into my browser, it takes me to YouTube, where I have a lot of options to edit the video:



16. Be editing the video, I can: change the title, edit the description, even change my mind and delete it!



17. Then, I'll save my changes:



18. Last thing: if you want to be sure Closed Captioning or subtitles are available so that all students can access your video, but you're not seeing that option on your video, go to: **Video Details > "More options"** and scroll down to set the video language to English, and then CC is activated/available in my video. Then, save your changes.
